ORDINANCE NO. 21-72

AMENDMENT TO CHAPTER 9 OF
THE LANE CODE

The Board of County Commissioners of Lane County ordains as follows:

Chapter 9 of Lane Code is hereby amended by removing pages 9.035 - 9.050 and 9.075 - 9.080, substituting therefor pages 9.035 - 9.050 and 9.075 - 9.080, respectively. Said pages are attached hereto as "Exhibit A" and incorporated herein by reference. The purpose of this amendment is to further refine the requirements dealing with transport of hauled refuse, treatment of surfaced leachate at disposal sites, identification of pest vectors, and drainage and erosion controls for disposal sites; and further to provide the health department authority to include additional standards and modifications in the operational plans for a disposal site.

9.035 Refuse Hauling Regulations. No person shall transport or carry refuse in or on a motor vehicle or trailer, upon a public road in the county, unless such refuse is either:

(a) completely covered on all sides and on the top and bottom thereof and such cover is either a part of or securely fastened to the body of such motor vehicle or trailer; or

(b) securely tied to the body of such motor vehicle or trailer so that no piece, article, item or part of such refuse is not fastened to the body of such motor vehicle or trailer.

(c) contained in the body of the transport vehicle in such a way as not to cause any part of the hauled refuse to be deposited upon any roadway or driveway in the county.

9.040 License for Disposal Site.

(1) No person shall operate a solid waste disposal site without first obtaining a license from the director.

(2) All applications for issuance or renewal of solid waste disposal site licenses shall be made to and filed with the director on forms furnished by him for such purpose and shall be accompanied by the license fee.

9.045 License Fee for Disposal Site.

(1) The license fee shall be payable at the time of application and shall be due on or before the 30th day of June preceding the year in which the license is issued. Fees becoming due for any year shall be prorated on a quarterly basis. If any application for a license is denied, the deposited license fee, less the cost of processing the application, shall be returned to the applicant.

(2) The license fee for a disposal site to be used by the person making the application solely for the disposal of solid waste created by the applicant shall be \$250.00.

(3) The license fee for a disposal site which is or may be used for the disposal of solid waste created by more than one person shall be \$500.00.

9.050 Applications for License for a Disposal Site. In addition to the application fee that the director may require, the following materials shall be filed with any original application for a disposal site:

(1) A description of the property proposed; a boundary map of the property under the application, drawn on assessor's maps or the equivalent, or an aerial photograph showing boundaries of the property;

(2) A description of public roads providing direct access to the property; and

(3) If the applicant is other than owner of property, written consent of the owner.

9.075 County Exemption from License. The county shall be exempt from the licensing requirements of this chapter.

9.080 Operation Standards of Disposal Sites. Operation and maintenance of disposal sites shall be in conformance with the following conditions which may be waived at the discretion of the health officer. A waiver shall be put in writing and on such terms, conditions and limitations that the purpose of this chapter will be fully observed:

(a) Operation and maintenance shall be under the direction of a competent person. One person shall be in charge of and at the fill site at all times when open to the public, and adequate signs posted to direct the public.

(b) The face of the working fill shall be kept as narrow as is practicable with the equipment working on the site.

(c) The fill of any sanitary landfill shall be compacted and covered with at least six (6) inches of accepted compacted cover at the end of each day's operation.

(d) Bulky waste materials, concrete or other bulky waste materials shall be promptly incorporated within the fill and covered as final cover material.

(e) The covering for surface and side slopes shall be maintained at a depth of twenty-four (24) inches after compaction. All existing ditches, fills and excavation shall be protected from erosion and adequate surface drainage provided.

(f) The depth of refuse within the cell shall not exceed eight (8) feet after compaction. If this is exceeded, special methods of spreading and compacting will be necessary as approved.

(g) The blowing of paper shall be done by use of approved methods or other approved methods.

(h) An adequate amount of water under pressure shall be available at the site for fire protection, dust control, and washing, the latter to be done on gratings or similar structures.

(i) Fencing shall be required around each cell when working in the disposal areas.

(j) Vector control methods shall be applied when necessary for control of flies, mosquitoes, rodents, and other pests as identified by the Vector Control Officer.

(k) The maintenance program shall be continued after the operations are completed until the fill has become stable.

(l) Disposal sites shall be required when toxic materials are disposed of in the site area.

(m) Plans for on site treatment of any surfaced leachate shall be included in original layout plans for all sites.

(n) The standards or modifications of the above standards shall be included into operational plans of a disposal site and approved by the health officer to protect public health.

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
