the dog. If determination is made to destroy the dog, the dog may be destroyed immediately. If the veterinarian determines instead that the dog should be given treatment, such treatment may be given; provided, however, the dog may be destroyed if unclaimed by its owner within 120 hours after being delivered to the veterinarian.

(2) Any peace officer or Dog Control Officer may humanely destroy any dog too severely injured to move and not on the property of its owner, when the owner is either unknown or cannot be reached after reasonable attempts to do so.

(3) Arrangements for fees, selection of veterinarians, liability of veterinarians, etc., shall be as determined by separate contracts between the Dog Control Authority and individual veterinarians.

(4) The owner shall pay for any reasonable medical expenses incurred in accordance with this section.

5.275 Summons and Complaint. Any police officer or Dog Control Officer investigating a dog complaint may sign, issue, and serve upon a dog owner a summons and complaint alleging an infraction of this ordinance based upon either the personal knowledge of the officer, or upon the statement of a complaining witness in whose presence the infraction occurred.

5.280 Receipts. All receipts for fees collected in connection with LC 5.165 to 5.280 shall be deposited in the Dog Fund. Receipts for forfeitures for violation of those sections shall be deposited in the General Fund.

5.400 Nonmotorized Traffic Prohibitions.

(1) Except for those persons engaged in obtaining emergency services for a disabled motor vehicle, those persons performing duties in connection with repair and maintenance of the road or other lawful governmental function, or those persons that have received a permit from the Director, Lane County Department of Public Works, no person shall walk or go upon the following described area in nonmotorized vehicles:

Any part of the right of way which is enclosed by fences or which is 80 feet from the centerline of that portion of Delta Highway commencing at the point at which Delta Highway intersects County Road No. 515, commonly known as Country Club Road, then continuing northerly to the point at which Delta Highway passes over Beltline Road.

(2) The Director, Lane County Department of Public Works, may issue permits to those persons that make application for the purpose of operating a bicycle or walking in the area described in LC 5.400(1) above to persons 16 years of age or older.

(3) The application and permit shall be in a form as prescribed by the Director, Lane County Department of Public Works, and any permit issued shall be carried at all times by the permittee while utilizing the areas described in LC 5.400(1) above. In approving a permit, the Director herein may include such reasonable conditions such as prohibited hours as in said Director's sole discretion is determined reasonably necessary for the public safety.

(4) In addition to persons authorized under LC 5.990 below, any officer having the authority to sign traffic citations for violation of traffic statutes on the freeways included in the area described in LC 5.400(1) above shall have the authority to sign County Infraction complaints.
