The Board of County Commissioners of Lane County ordains as follows:

Chapter 2 of Lane Code is hereby amended by removing and substituting the following page:

Said page is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. The purpose of this substitution is to reduce the time period for the referral of Board measures from 110 days to 90 days when the Board elects not to place the measure in the voters pamphlet and declare an emergency.

An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance, being enacted by the Board in the exercise of its police power for the purpose of meeting such emergency and for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, shall take effect immediately.

It is hereby declared to be the intention of the Board that the sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses and phrases of this Code are severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this Code shall be declared unconstitutional or invalid by the valid judgment or decree of a court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality or invalidity shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs and sections of this Code.
