Vice-Chair Jerry Rust presided with Steve Cornacchia, Ellie Dumdi and Jack Roberts present. Bill Rogers excused. Judy Haldeman, Recording Secretary. Bud Hodson, Chuck Ellis, Ron DePiero, Marilyn Miller and Dick Parent present from the City Council of Dunes City.

1. INTRODUCTIONS

Rust convened the meeting for the Board of County Commissioners.

2. ADJUSTMENTS TO THE AGENDA

None.

3. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Marilyn Miller, 83500 Kiechle Arm Road, asked to what extent the County would have jurisdiction over the shorelands zone and commented that she would like to have plenty of opportunity for input from the citizens of Dunes City. She suggested that the County consider harvesting the weeds in the lake as part of the solution to the problem.

Sandy Ambrosio, Darlene's Resort, commented that she would like to have input from the public for the shorelands agreement.

Bob Anderson, 83929 Cloud Nine, Woahink Lake, asked if the public would be able to ask questions during the meeting and Rust responded that he would try to allow for questions.

Dave Lauk, 83550 Kiechle Arm Road, asked the Board to consider biological controls for the weeds in the lake.

Galen Chapman, 4960 Lake Shore Drive, commented that some of the criteria for the shorelands zone had been reviewed recently and stated that grandfathering should be established.

Steve Chung, 2385 18th Street, asked if the Board would be discussing forest lands today and Rust responded that this issue was not on the Agenda.

4. COMMISSIONERS' ANNOUNCEMENTS

5. EXECUTIVE SESSION AS PER ORS 19222.660

None.

6. ORDER 90-12-6-1/In the Matter of Renaming the Board Landing at Westlake Park the Martin Christensen Boat Landing at Westlake

Dumdi stated that the County had received a request from John and Julia Carlson to rename the boat landing after Martin Christensen. Bob Keefer, Parks Manager, stated that the people of Dunes City had done the work on this item. He stated that the County would continue to maintain the site and provide a sign naming the boat landing.

MOTION: Approval. Dumdi MOVED, Roberts SECONDED. VOTE: 4-0.

7. DISCUSSION/Shorelands Agreement

Jim Johnson, County Administrator, commented that the area that deals with shorelands needs to be addressed by both Dunes City and the County as well as the Division of State Lands. Miller commented that this agreement was in the discussion phase in Dunes City. Dumdi will bring this up for discussion with Jay Rasmussen from the Oregon Coastal Zone Management Association; Johnson suggested that it be discussed with Roy Burns, Land Management Manager, and Gary Darnielle, L-COG. Cornacchia commented that all those that are affected should be alerted prior to a decision being made on shorelands.

8. DISCUSSION/Lake Weeds on Siltcoos Lake

Miller commented that a brief study was done regarding the use of carp as an algae control. She stated that this control was not successful when it was used in Lincoln City and she suggested that there be investigation into harvesting the weeds prior to using chemical or biological methods of control. Rust discussed the use of alum in septic tanks as a possible alternative. Henry McKinley, Dunes City Planning Commission, questioned the use of alum and commented that it would take many years for the nutrients to be flushed out of the water table. He stated that the long-range solution was sewers. Rust suggested that a joint letter be written from Dunes City and Lane County to Oregon State University requesting

their assistance in this matter. Dunes City will draft the letter to OSU. Dumdi will contact Douglas County as well to determine how much of Siltcoos Lake is in Douglas County.


9. DISCUSSION/Bike Path/Foot Path on Clear Lake Road

Kathleen Aitkens, City Recorder, commented that a letter was drafted to Lane County regarding concern for pedestrians on Clear Lake Road. Johnson stated that he would follow up on this if she would let him know who she sent the letter to. Rust stated that the Public Works Department would need to make a recommendation on Clear Lake Road. Cornacchia suggested that, in the interest of safety, bikes and pedestrians not be placed on the same path.

10. EMERGENCY BUSINESS

None.

There being no further business, this meeting adjourned at 11:08 a.m. for a tour of the roads around Dunes City which were part of the gravel roads program.
