Vice-Chair Jerry Rust presided with Steve Cornacchia, Ellie Dumdi and Jack Roberts present. Bill Rogers excused. Judy Haldeman, Recording Secretary.

1. PUBLIC HEARINGS

- a. PUBLIC HEARING/Public Works Five-Year Capital Improvement Program (CIP) Continued Discussion and Order Scheduled for May 22 BCC Meeting)

John Goodson, Public Works Director, introduced this item to the Board.


Rust opened the Public Hearing.

Terry Smith, Deputy Public Works Director, City of Eugene, commented that the city had done an analysis of the sewer project to try to determine what would be the maximum amount of County Road Funds needed to pay for trench repairs, pavement repairs and rehabilitation. \$9,076,009 would be needed over a seven-year period for these repairs and would relieve the median property owners by \$760.00 or 15-20 percent.

Harold Chapman, 51 Chapman, commented that he was interested in reducing the financial hardship to residents on the sewer project, but he asked the Board to take the time to fully understand the long-term consequences of approving the request for use of Road Funds on the street repairs for River Road. He stated that the number one purpose of the Road Fund should be to make Lane County roads as safe as possible for the traveling public.

Rob Laney, 36765 Immigrant Road, Pleasant Hill, commented that the Highway 58 Safety Committee felt that getting on and off of Highway 58 was a major concern for residents in Pleasant Hill. The committee
