

IN THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF LANE COUNTY, OREGON

ORDINANCE NO. PA 979

) IN THE MATTER OF RENAMING THE BYPASSED
) PORTION OF HIGHWAY 126 BETWEEN ELMIRA
) AND NOTI TO SUTTLE ROAD

WHEREAS, Lane County has executed an intergovernmental agreement with the State Department of Transportation in which the County accepted jurisdiction of bypassed portion of Oregon Route 126, and

WHEREAS, renaming the bypassed portion of road will eliminate confusion that exists between it and the recently realigned Oregon Route 126, and

WHEREAS, on April 26, 1990 an informal meeting with adjoining landowners was conducted at the Veneta Community Center to explain the road naming process and to solicit possible new names for the road, and

WHEREAS, on June 27, 1990 the Lane County Board of Commissioners discussed the matter and directed staff to conduct a road name preference survey by mailout to adjoining landowners, to obtain a final recommendation for new road name, and

WHEREAS, the road name preference survey was conducted and a majority of the adjoining landowners have selected the name of Suttle Road as their first choice for a new road name, and

WHEREAS, on September 26, 1990, the Lane County Board of Commissioners conducted the First Reading of this Ordinance, and on October 24, 1990, conducted the Second Reading and held a public hearing to consider the road renaming ordinance,


NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of County Commissioners of Lane County ordains as follows:

1. That the bypassed portion of Highway 126 between Elmira and Noti, is renamed to either [Suttle Road] or ~~[Farmer Hale Road]~~ and is hereby assigned County Road Number 2232. *BR*


2. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions.

While not a part of this Ordinance, findings attached as Exhibit 'A' are adopted in support of this decision.



Exhibit "A" Ordinance No. PA 979
FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

I. Lane County has executed an intergovernmental agreement with the State Department of Transportation in which the County accepted jurisdiction of the bypassed portion of Highway 126 between Elmira and Noti. Both the new section of highway and the bypassed section are commonly known as highway 126 or Route F. It is necessary to rename the bypassed section to eliminate confusion between the two.

II. Lane Manual Chapter 15, requires that Road Naming and Renaming be consistent with the following criteria:

1. 15.015(1) Required Review and Action. The Board of Commissioners shall review and take appropriate action on all road naming and renaming when:

- (1) Any existing public or County road is named or renamed.

The Board of Commissioners held the first reading of the ordinance on September 26, 1990 and the second reading and Public Hearing on October 24, 1990.

2. 15.020(2) The application may be submitted by any of the following applicants:
 - a) The property owner(s) or persons living along the road.
 - b) Any public or semi-public agency whose function is affected by roads.
 - c) Lane County:
 - (i) Board
 - (ii) Planning Commission
 - (iii) Planning Division
 - (iv) Department of Transportation

The above criteria are met in that the road naming process is being initiated by Lane County through its Land Management Division of the Department of Public Works, with final adoption by the Board of Commissioners.

3. 15.020(3) The proposed name should comply with the following standards:
 - (a) Name limited to maximum of 12 letters and one word.
 - (b) No duplication with other existing road names.
 - (c) No similar sounding or confusing names.

EXHIBIT "A"

SUTTLE ROAD The name Suttle contains six letters, and one word. Road is not considered to be a separate word.

The County Surveyor has completed a review of the road records and has determined that the proposed name, Suttle road, is not in duplication or in conflict with any similar sounding road names in Lane County.

The proposed name change to Suttle Road is supported by the Veneta and Noti Postmasters. The Veneta Rural Fire District has requested a change to anything that does not bear resemblance to either "126" or "Route F". The road name change as proposed will eliminate any confusion that currently exists between the two roads.
