Currently, we are not meeting any of our goals.

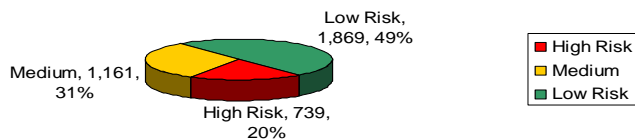

Total Capacity Based Releases Estimate 08/09



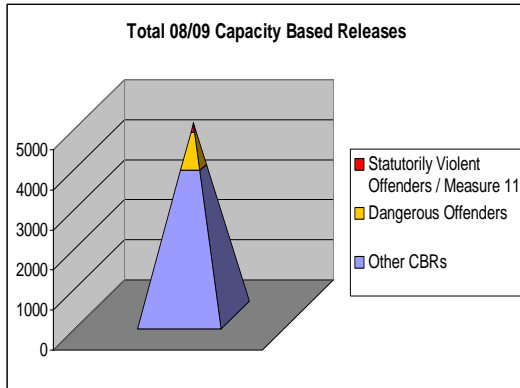
- ❖ Total Actual Number of Inmates Capacity Based Released from July, 2008 to April 26, 2009: **3,769**.

# Goal #1: Protecting the Public



- ❖ All 84 Beds will target the first prioritized goal: Immediate Protection of the Public
- ❖ The Target Group: Dangerous offenders and defendants
- ❖ Three sub groups of dangerous defendants and offenders:
  - ❖ Measure 11: 8 to date (08/09). 10 total estimate for 08/09.
  - ❖ Statutorily defined violent: 140 to date (08/09). 170 total estimate for 08/09.
  - ❖ High Risk for being a danger to the public: 739 to date (08/09) 900 total estimate for 08/09.

# Who Makes Up This Dangerous Group?

## ❖ Measure 11 Defendant

Examples: Kidnapping, Rape 1&2, Murder, Attempted Murder, Assault 1&2, Manslaughter, Robbery 1&2, Arson, Sodomy 1&2, Compelling Prostitution, Sex Abuse 1.



## ❖ Statutorily Violent Offender

Examples: Robbery 3, Assault 3&4, Criminal Mistreatment, Felony DUII, Criminally Negligent Homicide



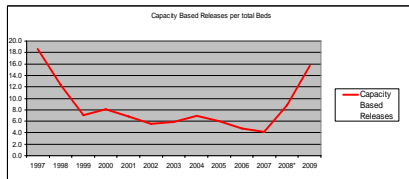
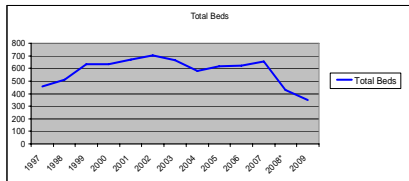
## ❖ High Risk for Dangerousness

## Total Beds to Capacity Based Releases Per Bed Ratio



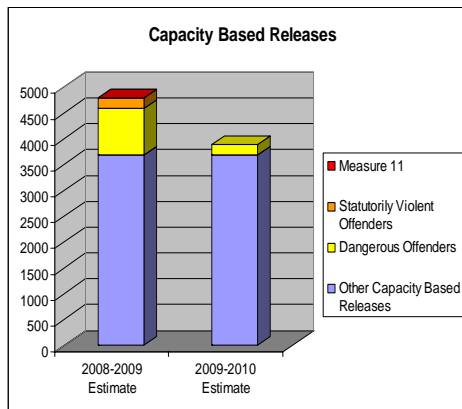
Capacity Based Releases Per Bed

- ❖ More Beds = Fewer Forced Releases
- ❖ Less Beds = More Forced Releases
- ❖ Adjusted for the number of Bookings & based on averages since 1998, for every one bed added, there will be approximately nine fewer CBRs annually.

## What 84 Beds Means

- ❖ 84 Beds = 78 beds after the federal consent decree is applied.
- ❖ 28,470 more jail bed days for inmates to get through court or serve a sentence or sanction.
- ❖ 702 fewer CBRs
