
WHEREAS, the State Legislature recently adopted SB 1145 and directed the creation of the Public Safety Coordinating Councils in the various counties throughout the state, charging these councils with responsibility for system-wide criminal justice planning, and

WHEREAS, the Lane County Public Safety Coordinating Council is the appropriate forum for such discussions, as reflected in the "Community Corrections Partnership Act" of 1995 in which Local Public Safety Coordinated Councils were charged with focusing on community safety, and


WHEREAS, the Public Safety Coordinating Council, a regional advisory council for the Board of County Commissioners, is charged with ensuring every effort is taken to effectively use resources to prevent crime, reduce crime, hold offenders accountable, and increase the safety within our communities,

NOW, THEREFORE IT IS HERBY ORDERED that the proposed PSCC Community Safety Benchmark Project, developed and planned by PSCC Research and Evaluation Committee to provide a method by which the PSCC can track and report on a set of measurable indicators of community safety in Lane County, is hereby approved.
