WHEREAS, the Regional Investment Board has solicited and reviewed a number proposals submitted by various agencies and governments within the region, and



NOW THEREFORE IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED that the Lane County Board of Commissioners does hereby approve of the projects recommended by the Regional Investment Board, and directs the Cascades West Economic Development District, as the fiscal agent for the Regional Investment Board, to complete contracts with the sponsors of the approved projects.

**SUBJECT:** Recommendations from the BL3 Regional Investment Board Regarding Funding of Projects for the FY 2001-2003 Biennium

### RECOMMENDATION:

The BL3 Regional Investment Board met on March 18<sup>th</sup> and unanimously voted to recommend funding projects on lists A and B of Attachment A. (Dollars anticipated from the State would fully fund projects on list A; projects on list B would be funded as dollars becomes available due, interest income or receipt of additional monies from the State, etc.)

Each Board of Commissioners must approve the project list in order for the projects on the list to receive funding.

### PROCESS FOR SELECTING PROJECTS:

In November 2001, the four Boards of Commissioners approved the *Benton, Lane, Lincoln and Linn Regional Investment Strategy 2001 – 2003*. That document outlined the process and criteria to be used for the solicitation, review and selection of projects to receive funding from the BL3 allocation of state Regional Investment Funds and Rural Investment Funds.

A call for project proposals was issued via mail and email in December 2001. The deadline for project proposals was February 13, 2002. One hundred five (105) proposals were received.

On March 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup>, committees of the Regional Investment Board reviewed the proposals. Each committee reviewed the projects associated with one of the four *Regional Investment Strategy* goal areas: economic development, infrastructure development, workforce development, and rural development. The committees included one RIB member from each county. Project sponsors were invited to attend the meeting and provide a brief overview of their project and respond to questions. Each committee ranked the projects according to how well they met the *Regional Investment Strategy* funding criteria (see below).

On March 15<sup>th</sup>, a committee comprised of one member from each of the four project review committees (one from each County) met to consolidate the four sets of ranked projects into a single set. On March 18<sup>th</sup>, the full RIB reviewed the consolidated list and is now recommending it to the Boards of Commissioners for approval.

The Regional Investment Board had anticipated having two rounds of funding in the current biennium; the second round was to take place in the fall of 2002. However, due to the funding cut made in the Regional and Rural Investment Funds by the Governor and Legislature (estimated to be an 18% reduction) and to the number

of quality projects proposed in the current round, the Board is proposing that all of the anticipated funds be committed at this time. While there would not be a second round of funding, based on past experience, it is likely that some dollars will not be spent due to project under-spending. These funds could be used to respond to a unique opportunity or pressing funding need, should one arise over the next 12-14 months.

It should be noted that the list of recommended projects does not include "multi-region" projects. A portion of the Regional Investment funds allocated to each region is designated by the State for multi-region projects – these are projects that receive funds from or impact/benefit more than one region. For the 2001-2003 biennium, the State has estimated that the BL3 Region will receive \$198,374 for multi-region projects. The BL3 Regional Investment Board appointed a committee to draft a process for solicitation and review of multi-region projects; the RIB will discuss how to proceed at its meeting on May 17<sup>th</sup>. The Boards of Commissioners will receive future recommendations regarding multi-region projects.

#### **CRITERIA FOR SELECTING PROJECTS:**

Each of the projects recommended for funding has been determined to be eligible for funding pursuant to the ORS and to advance at least one of the four goals of the *Regional Investment Strategy*. In addition, each project was determined to contribute to one or more of the intermediate outcomes identified in the *Strategy*. The State will evaluate the success of the Regional and Rural Investment Programs in Benton, Lane, Lincoln and Linn Counties based on the extent to which the investment of funds affects these outcomes:

- Increase in jobs created or retained
- Increase in funding for infrastructure to support business development
- Number of priority projects in rural communities that move forward (these may be community development as well as economic development priorities)
- Number of people trained who gain employment or improve wages
- Number of people utilizing distance-learning opportunities

According to the proposals, the 41 projects on list A recommended for funding would:

- Retain or create approximately 240 jobs over a two-year period
- Invest \$1,781,099 in infrastructure projects (including the Regional and Rural Investment Funds and other dollars leveraged)
- Assist 29 priority projects located in rural areas
- Train approximately 440-450 people
- Not impact distance-learning opportunities (None of the projects recommended for funding would involve distance learning.)

In addition to outcomes, the Regional Investment Board considered a number of other factors in selecting projects for funding, including: match and leverage (in-kind and cash), project readiness, distress of the community, severity of problem to be addressed, the extent to which the Regional/Rural Investment Funds fill a funding gap, partnerships and collaborations that support the project, number and wages of jobs created or retained, extent to which the project serves needs of minorities and disadvantaged, and the capacity of the sponsoring organization to undertake the project.

This is the second biennium of the BL3 Regional/Rural Investment Program and Attachment B provides a two-biennia view of the investments made/proposed.

#### **NEXT STEP:**

Following action by the Boards of Commissioners on the recommended list of projects, Cascades West Economic Development District (i.e. Cascades West and Lane Councils of Governments) as the fiscal agent for the BL3 Regional and Rural Investment Programs, will draft a contract with each project sponsor.
